Not through hate.

Not through one leader controlling everyone.

Humanity changes one human at a time.

Every person who wins the battle within becomes living proof of what humanity can become.

**The human family.**

All human beings as one body.

Centuries ago, the great Persian poet Saadi wrote:

بنی آدم اعضای یک پیکرند  
که در آفرینش ز یک گوهرند  
چو عضوی به درد آورد روزگار  
دگر عضوها را نماند قرار  
تو کز محنت دیگران بی غمی  
نشاید که نامت نهند آدمی

**Human beings are members of one body,  
created from one essence.**

**When one member is wounded by time,  
the other members cannot remain at peace.**

**If you are not moved by the suffering of others,  
you are not worthy of being called human.**

This wisdom is not old.

It is unfinished.

Saadi saw centuries ago what humanity still struggles to understand today: we are not separate from one another. The pain of one human family, one child, one

nation, or one forgotten people does not remain isolated.  
It spreads through the body of humanity.

Some may ask:

How does the pain of someone far away affect me?

If I cannot feel their physical pain in my own body, why  
should I care?

The answer begins with imagination.

**Change places with them.**

Imagine it is you who is hungry.

Imagine it is you who is afraid.

Imagine it is you who is losing your child, your home,  
your future, or your dignity.

Would you want the world to ignore you?

Would you want people to say, "That is not my

I am not claiming to know every mechanism of derivatives, markets, banking, or economic design.

That is not where I am looking from.

I am looking at the system itself.

Because when you step back far enough, a different question begins to emerge:

Not only how the system works.

But why it exists.

Who it serves.

And what it is doing to humanity over time.

I believe this:

When humanity becomes truly united, the answers we are searching for will no longer remain hidden.

They will reveal themselves.

Because the human mind becomes clearer when it is no longer controlled by fear.

The human heart becomes stronger when it is no longer divided by hate.

And human life becomes more meaningful when time is no longer reduced to money.

This is why the real shift is not only economic.

It is human.

And the tragedy is this:

History.

Intent.

Why three judges?

In parts of Africa and the Middle East, slavery also existed long before European colonial expansion. Some enslaved people worked as servants, soldiers, laborers, administrators, concubines, or members of royal courts. In certain societies, enslaved individuals could sometimes earn freedom, marry into society, own limited property, or rise in status through military service, loyalty, education, or skill.

But none of this made slavery humane.

Families were separated.

Violence existed.

Freedom was denied.

Human beings were still treated as property.

The point is not to excuse earlier slavery.

The point is to understand its evolution.

In many earlier civilizations, slavery was often treated as a social, military, economic, or legal condition rather than a permanent racial identity inherited endlessly through generations.

The system was cruel.

But it had not yet evolved into the fully industrialized global machine that later emerged through colonial expansion.

At this stage in history, powerful rulers mostly controlled the human body.

But even in the ancient world, not every ruler governed through fear alone.

One of the most respected examples was Cyrus the Great, founder of the Persian Empire nearly 2,500 years ago. Compared to many rulers of his time, Cyrus introduced a more tolerant and humane model of leadership. Historical records describe policies that allowed conquered peoples to maintain their religions, customs, languages, and cultural identities rather than forcing complete assimilation through terror and destruction.

Some historians view the Cyrus Cylinder as one of the earliest known expressions of humane governance and respect for conquered peoples.

The Persian system was not perfect.

No ancient civilization was.

But for its time, it represented a different direction in leadership —

one built more on stability, dignity, cooperation, and coexistence than pure domination alone.
